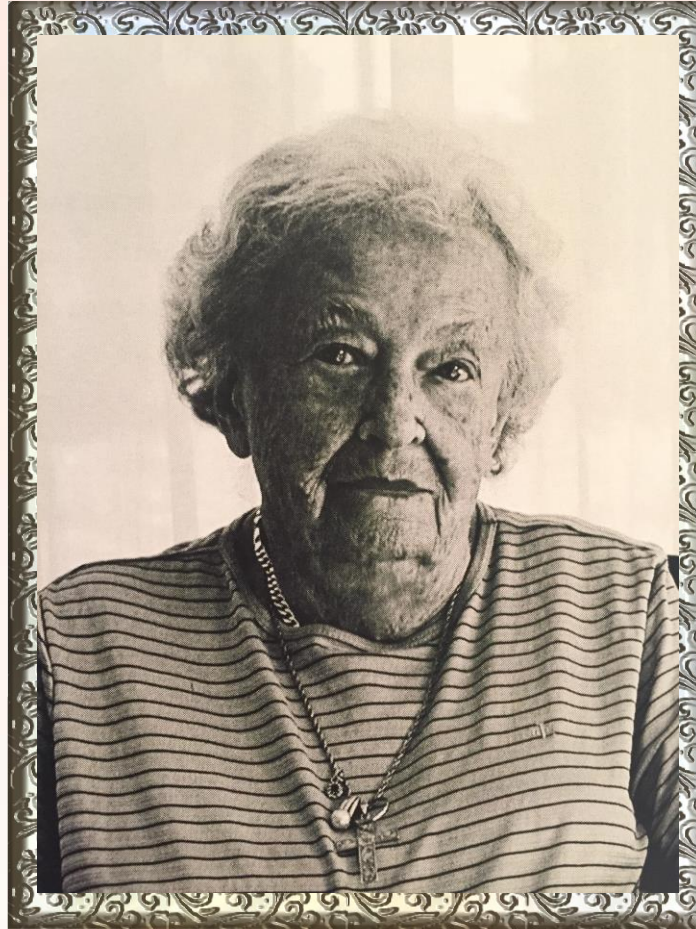

Dragica Krog Radoš

September 19, 1918 – May 26, 2015



Dragica Krog Radoš was born to Nikola Krog and Zora Krog Bolfek in the Upper Town of Zagreb, Croatia, on September 19, 1918. She was an accomplished actress and soubrette, a proud and uncompromising patriot, a philanthropist and a person of deep faith.

Song was an every day event at her family home; at the early age of twelve, she formally began performing at the Croatian National Theater, doing walk-on roles in operas and operettas, filling a need for a child's role and singing in the children's choir.

These early experiences led to subsequent accomplished performances in both operas and operettas with emphasis on drama acting. She was recognized for her unique ability to take on roles without systematic or incremental rehearsals on stage with other members of the performing ensemble. She would enter the stage performance after only one or two rehearsals. At the early age twenty one, she was entrusted roles and performances in the drama and operetta repertoire, and demonstrated consummated dramatic abilities. She was one of the first members of the Gavella Theater. Disrupted by the events of WWII, Dragica had to leave Zagreb and say farewell to her professional career.



She lived through, and survived the Bleiburg Holocaust in Austria, being an in situ witness to man's inhumanity to other. She took residence in Argentina creating with her husband, Franjo, a small and successful industry before emigrating to the US, which was her childhood dream. She continued with her early efforts to promote liberty in her native Croatia before, during and after the Liberation War, and do philanthropic work in the area of theater and drama, and children of war. Fifty years after her exile, she was able to return to her beloved Zagreb, which she continued to visit yearly, up until the age of 94.

Dragica passed away unexpectedly in Burlingame, on May 26, 2015. She will be forever missed by those who knew her. She is survived by her son, Damir, grandson Joseph, grandchildren Carla and Joseph Jr, and a very large and loving family, spanning four generations, living both in Croatia and Germany.
